

Scope Statement:

This guide details resources available to state employees in the fields of elementary and secondary education. Additionally, state employees can contact the State Library for more information about available services, reference help and publications at 614-644-7051 or refhelp@library.ohio.gov.

Electronic Collections:

- **Education Research Complete:** Topics covered include all levels of education from early childhood to higher education, and all educational specialties, such as multilingual education, health education, and testing. *Education Research Complete* provides indexing and abstracts for more than 2,100 journals, as well as full text for more than 1,200 journals, and includes full text for nearly 500 books and monographs.
- **ERIC:** The Education Resource Information Center, contains more than 1,300,000 records and links to more than 317,000 full-text documents dating back to 1966.
- **Academic Search Complete (EBSCO):** Academic Search Complete provides access to more than 7,100 full-text periodicals, including more than 6,100 peer-reviewed journals. In addition to full text, this database offers indexing and abstracts for more than 11,200 journals and a total of more than 11,700 publications including monographs, reports, conference proceedings, etc. The database features PDF content going back as far as 1887, with the majority of full text titles in searchable PDF format.
- **Professional Development Collection (EBSCO):** Designed for professional educators, this database provides a highly specialized collection of nearly 520 high quality education journals, including more than 350 peer-reviewed titles. This database also contains more than 200 educational reports. *Professional Development Collection* is the most comprehensive collection of full text education journals in the world.
- **OhioLINK- Electronic Journal Center (EJC):** Full text of 7000+ research journals.
