InterLibrary Loan

As a state employee, your requested books and articles are usually supplied by the State Library collection, the OhioLINK collection, or OhioLINK's article databases. However, there are times when none of those has what you need, so we turn to InterLibrary Loan (ILL). Here's how it works.

Books

When you search for a book title (or video or government publication) using our WorldCat Local search box on our Web site, you will notice that items in the State Library collection come first, followed by those in OhioLINK libraries. The next category is WorldCat libraries and these are items that we can potentially get for you from other libraries by way of OCLC's InterLibrary Loan system. **Note:** even if a title is not found using our WorldCat Local search, it might still be possible to get it.



To request an InterLibrary loan, call us at 614-644-7061 and ask for InterLibrary Loan, or email circhelp@library.ohio.gov.

Remember that these requests should be for items that you as a state employee need for your job. Most public libraries will attempt to ILL items for pleasure reading or school that they do not have. We cannot guarantee total success at getting items through ILL, as

some items cannot be found in other libraries and some just don't circulate. However, the odds for success are very good. **Please be aware that books and media borrowed through ILL have a limited circulation period – normally three to four weeks.**

Articles

Articles that are not in full-text online and not in journals that we have in our collection can usually be speedily acquired elsewhere. The best source for medical articles is an online system called DocLine. The others are gotten using OCLC's InterLibrary Loan system which sends our requests to other libraries. We, in turn, respond to other libraries' article requests with the journals that we have. Despite the name, articles are not really loaned and do not have to be returned.



Today, the vast majority of articles are exchanged in digital format (PDF files). When we do receive paper articles or copy them from our paper or microfilmed journals, a scanner is used to digitize them so that they can be e-mailed to you. This has greatly sped up the process.
