## JOURNAL ALERTS

**3** Our **Current Awareness** service is now in its fifth year. Especially popular is the **Journal Table of Contents Alerts** part of it, with 130 state employees currently enrolled. This enables you to pick magazines and journals from a list [www.library.ohio.gov/research/cur\\_aware/toc](http://www.library.ohio.gov/research/cur_aware/toc) and get the table of contents from them e-mailed to you each time a new issue is added. Remember that you can indicate the need for titles not on our list by clicking on the **box marked Other at the bottom of the page** before clicking on the Submit Form button.

**4** The State Library does conduct **training sessions** on how to make the best use of our services. These are done either online or in our training room. To see what is currently scheduled, go to our **State Employee Resources** page and click on **Continuing Education Calendar** in the right column under **Links**. You'll see the current month and can check future months by clicking on the arrows to the right of the month. For more information and to register, click on the name of the session.

**5** Many of you might have experienced a sudden inability to order material online or get access to the OhioLINK databases. Don't panic! Nine times out of ten, it is because **your State Library card has expired**. Simply call our Circulation Desk number of 614-644-6950 and you will be all set in just a few moments.



**6** Those of you looking for legal material should try **HeinOnline**. It contains articles from many legal journals, access to the Federal Register and the CFR, and many other features. The latest to be added to our subscription is **Session Laws**, which include Ohio bills and laws dating all the way back to 1803. To access this service, look under **Electronic Reference Resources** on our **State Employee Resources** page.



**7** When using the search box labeled **Find Books and Other Resources** at the top of our home page [www.library.ohio.gov](http://www.library.ohio.gov), the best strategy is to use the **Advanced Search** and to limit the results to **OhioLINK Libraries** (rather than Libraries Worldwide). This allows you to be more specific about what you want and to limit by date up front. Asking for items in OhioLINK Libraries always shows you what the State Library has first, and only shows you items that you can order directly using your State Library card.
