### Mango Languages

Free mobile access to more than 34 foreign language courses and 14 English as a Second Language courses. Create an account to use Mango.



### EBSCOhost

Discover, read, or save full-text articles from many EBSCO databases right from your smartphone. Create a MyEBSCO account to use EBSCOhost.



### Overdrive Media Console

Access thousands of [Ohio eBook Project](http://ohioebookproject.org) eBooks & eAudiobooks on your mobile devices.



### HeinOnline

Access the world's largest image-based legal research database, HeinOnline, on your iPhone® or iPad®. Note: this app uses IP authentication to verify your account monthly.



### Congressional Record

For current information from the U.S. Congress, read the daily edition of the Congressional Record.



### KnowItNow

This app provides access to KnowItNow librarians throughout the state of Ohio. Enter your Zip code and chat with a librarian any time.



### Scopus

The world's largest abstract and citation database of peer-reviewed literature and quality web sources. Note: create a Scopus account to access.



### PubMed

Multiple ways to search PubMed/MEDLINE, PICO, askMEDLINE and Consensus for medical information.

## Tips for Getting Started & Using Recommended Library Apps

**EBSCOHost:** The EBSCOHost app allows you to access all of your EBSCO content from your mobile phone. Since it is a subscription resource, you will need to follow several steps to activate the application on your mobile device. First, start at the full EBSCO site and select the mobile device link at the bottom of the page. EBSCO will send an email to the address of your choice and then you will need to follow the instructions provided to get access on your mobile device. Once these instructions are completed, you can access EBSCO from your phone from anywhere. When you find a PDF article you would like to read, you can save it to the iBooks, Kindle, Evernote or Dropbox apps for easier reading and saving. [iPhone, iPad, iPod Touch, Android]

**OverDrive:** You can find and access ebooks through the OverDrive app. This app is available through your device's app store. Once the app is downloaded, you can identify your library by entering your city or zip code and then start browsing books from your library's site. Once you have found a book that you would like to read, simply check out and download the title. It will appear within the OverDrive app and you can read the book from there. [iPhone, iPad, iPod Touch, Android]

**Mango Languages:** To use the Mango Languages app on your mobile device, you will need to start at your library's page and find the link for Mango Languages. You will be asked to create an account the first time you use Mango Languages. Once you have created an account from your library's website, you can use this login information to access Mango from your mobile device. Since your accounts are linked by your email login, you can start a course on your mobile device and continue it on your home computer. This app allows you to access all of the language courses available in the full version of Mango Languages on the go! [iPhone, iPad, iPod Touch]

**HeinOnline:** You can find and access government and legal resources on your mobile device with the HeinOnline app. Since it's a subscription resource, you'll need to log in. Click the IP Authentication button in the app if you have IP authentication through your agency building. To continue to use this app, you'll have to re-authenticate the app at your agency once a month. [iPhone, iPad, iPod Touch]

**KnowItNow:** To chat with a librarian any time, input your zip code into the Know It Now app. Provide your name and other optional information to be connected to an Ohio librarian. [iPhone, Android]

**Scopus:** Use this app to search across Scopus articles and citations, view abstracts, set up and receive alerts of favorite searches and author citations, annotate articles with your own notes or share article links through email. You'll need a Scopus account to use this app. Visit the Scopus database through OhioLINK. Click Register in the upper right hand corner to create an account. After your account has been created, use the Scopus login information to access these materials on your mobile device. [iPhone, iPad, Android, Blackberry]
