



Article Updates Reminder

Keeping up with the literature on your professional topics has never been easier. Through a service that we call **Current Awareness**, you can automatically receive the latest articles on your specific topic(s) or get the latest edition of many professional journals. It's as easy as filling out a brief form and submitting it to our Reference staff.

Start on our State Employee Resources page <http://library.ohio.gov/Marketing/StateEmps> and click on **Current Awareness Services** under Links. There are two page links there – **Topic Selection Alerts** and **Journal TOC Alerts**. When clicking on either, you are instructed to give your contact information. Use the **Submit Form** button at the bottom of each page to send us your requests.

Topic Selection alerts asks you to give information for an article search that you want us to do. Once that search has been set up, you will continue to get new articles by e-mail that match that search in the EBSCO databases from OhioLINK. Be

as specific as you can on your search request, but remember that not all topics will get good results from those databases.

Journal TOC alerts are done by the selection of the journals from our list. It is best that you limit yourself to 15 journals initially until you see how you like the results. As new editions of journals are added to the EBSCO databases and the OhioLINK Electronic Journal Center, you will be emailed their Tables of Content. This allows you to link to and read articles that are in full-text or to spot citations to articles that you want us to get for you. **Note:** there are many journals not on our list that work with this service – click on **Other** at the bottom of the list and we will contact you for additional titles that you want.

More Ohio Newspapers

OhioLINK currently provides searchable full-text access to five Ohio papers in their database from Newsbank called Ohio's Newspapers. State employees now have easy access to those five **plus an additional four** – Akron Beacon Journal, Canton Repository, Youngstown Vindicator and Springfield News-Sun.



To use the nine Ohio papers, go to our State Employee Resources page <http://library.ohio.gov/Marketing/StateEmps>. Click on **Ohio Newspapers** under Electronic Reference Resources. You will be asked to enter your name and the last nine digits from your State Library card.

On the Newsbank page, click on the **Ohio Newspapers** link at the bottom of the list of papers. That takes you to the search screen that also contains the date ranges for each paper. All but the Cincinnati Post are current.

Note: by clicking on the box next to each paper name, you can simultaneously search as many as you want.
