The State Library now has in its collection 243 professionally-produced social and health problem DVD videos owned by the Ohio Department of Alcohol and Drug Addiction Services (ODADAS). They are located across from our Circulation Desk and are **in our catalog** under the location **ODADAS Video Collection**. You can borrow them just like books.



While the majority of these videos are on substance abuse, there are many other problems covered such as suicide, teen anger, cyber-bullying, depression, and Hepatitis B. There is at least one full-length Hollywood production called "Less Than Zero."

The collection is also pretty current. 75% of the videos are dated 2000 or newer. If you want to see a complete list of the titles from our catalog, go to our [home page](#) and look in the left column for **Search Digital & Special Collections**. Click on it and on the next screen, go down to and under **Sources for electronic books, articles, and educational materials** select **ODADAS Clearinghouse Circulating DVD Collection**. The titles are arranged by date, with the newest first.

To search for your topic in these videos using the search box on our home page:

- 1) Set it to **State Library of Ohio**;
- 2) Put your topic (such as "substance abuse") in the box and click on the **Search** button;
- 3) On the results page, click on the **Modify Search** button at the top;
- 4) Set the **Material Type** box to **Audiovisuals** and click on the **Submit** button. The results will include titles with **ODADAS Video Collection** to the right of them.

**Government Made Easy!**

Take a look at **USA.gov** [www.usa.gov](http://www.usa.gov) to see if it lives up to its "Government made easy" claim – it certainly seems to. Winner of numerous awards, this site was born in 2000 as FirstGov.gov and changed its name to the present one in 2007.

Though USA.gov appears to be primarily aimed at the federal government, **state** and local (including tribal governments) are definitely included. There are several ways to get to these on their front page. You can click on **Find Government Agencies** or **Contact Government** at the top of the screen. A more interesting way is to click on **Government Employees** under **Just for You...** On the next screen, click on **Government Employees** and then on **For State and Local Employees**.
