OhioLINK and SearchOhio

The OhioLINK Central Catalog has been teamed up with SearchOhio for another way to get books sent to you. SearchOhio has nineteen member public libraries that have put their holdings into an online central catalog, making it easy for you to find and order a book that the OhioLINK Central Catalog does not have available.

OhioLINK already includes several large public libraries which are great sources for fiction (and nonfiction). However, if an OhioLink search does not yield what you want, click on the SearchOhio button at the top of the results screen. This automatically transfers your search to SearchOhio and shows you a list from which to choose your title.



Clicking on your title shows you all of the versions (print, DVD, etc.) of that title in SearchOhio. Click on the version that you want and you will get a record much like OhioLink's that tells you how many SearchOhio libraries have it, and that has a **Request this title** link. Click on that link and it will ask you to choose your library (**State Lib Ohio**) from a drop-down list and **submit** it. You will then be asked to enter your name, your number (last nine digits on your State Library card) and a pick-up location (SLO Main Library – it will be automatically sent to your office address from there).

The shipping process works just like OhioLINK's – the holding library sends it to the State Library where it is checked out and sent to you. You return it to us when it is due. Due dates and number of renewals permitted are the same as OhioLINK's for books but there are some differences for other types of items.

See "Prohibition"

Many of you probably saw the latest Ken Burns 3-episode documentary "Prohibition" when it was recently shown on PBS. For those who want to see it again (or for the first time), the State Library has added one copy on DVD to its collection. It's a 3-disc set that can be borrowed just like a book.

ODADAS Collection Update

The September issue of this publication described the **ODADAS collection of DVD videos** on social and health issues that can be borrowed through the State Library online catalog. The article told you how to find videos on your topic(s) that are part of that collection. There has been a **change to that process** which makes it **simpler and quicker**.

When you get the results screen from your initial search, click on the **Modify Search** button at the top. On the resulting **Keyword Search** screen, click on the little down arrow in the **Location** box, set it to **ODADAS Clearing House** (at the bottom of the list) and click on the **Submit** button.
