The Ohio eBook Project is your source for downloadable eBooks, audiobooks, music and videos. The website, www.ohioebooks.org, has a fresh new look featuring:

- a new logo design
- easier-to-find help screens
- more white space for easier reading
- a "rate this e-book" feature

Quick Tips

- An up-to-date list of [compatible](#) devices changes as new models enter the marketplace.
- Take a guided tour or use the MyHelp Wizard for customized [instructions](#).
- You can limit your search to currently available items, Kindle books, always available audiobooks, & more.
- Check out your item within an hour of adding it to your cart; it is then yours and you can take your time downloading your selection.
- You never need to return your downloads. Items automatically check themselves back in.
- Items without holds can be checked out a second time.
- If you made a mistake while creating your account information, you can edit and correct your email address to ensure you receive holds notices.
- If you receive a replacement library card, your digital check-outs and holds can be transferred to your new card number. Email [help](#) is available.




