



#### Updates Regarding Library Resources

The State Library of Ohio acquired the Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders, (DSM-5) as a database for state employees to use. The DSM-5 is a classification and diagnostic tool for healthcare professionals, serving as a universal authority for psychiatric diagnosis. The DSM is applicable in many situations and used by clinicians and researchers for many subjects such as biological, psychodynamic, cognitive, behavioral, interpersonal and family systems. Treatments are often determined by DSM classifications, therefore we are excited to provide this valuable resource to state employees using their State Library of Ohio card.


#### State of Ohio government documents

The Ohio Web Library only presents results from premium sources and makes no attempt to emulate a general search of the Internet. This will be especially useful for Individuals who need more than general "online" sources for projects.



#### Ask A Librarian Chat Service Updated

In addition to in-person, phone, and email, the librarians at the State Library are available through **KnowItNow24x7** when the library is open. After hours questions are directed to other librarians staffing the KnowItNow24x7 service. KnowItNow24x7 is an online reference service where librarians are available to answer your reference questions via the chat widget at [library.ohio.gov/knowitnow/](http://library.ohio.gov/knowitnow/). Librarians share their expertise and provide high-quality, authoritative websites and online database resources via web addresses within the chat. Employees may also email themselves a copy of the conversation at any point by clicking on the "envelope" icon on the widget. KnowItNow24x7 is made available free-of-charge to all residents of Ohio through a Library Services and Technology Act (LSTA) grant from the federal Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS) awarded by the State Library of Ohio.

**Can I use the Seal of Ohio in my presentation for work?**


**Answer:** Yes and no—The answer can be found in the Ohio Revised Code 5.10 State seal <http://codes.ohio.gov/orc/gp5.10>. The design of the great seal shall not be reproduced, except as required by any provision of the Ohio Constitution and the Revised Code, unless permission to do so is first obtained from the governor. The governor may authorize reproduction of the design of the great seal when the purpose is to:

- (A) Permit publication of a reproduction of the great seal of the state of Ohio;
- (B) Aid educational or historical programs;
- (C) Promote the economic or cultural development of the state in a manner deemed appropriate by the governor.
